Background:

The Herndon Community Center Pool is in need of maintenance in the form of white coating. The intent of this Invitation for Bid (IFB) is to establish a contract with a qualified contractor to furnish all labor, tools, materials, chemicals, paint, and equipment necessary for applying a whitecoat to the Town's swimming pool. The pool was last white coated in August 2019.

Bids were opened on June 13, 2023. The desired work dates are August 21, 2023, through September 1, 2023.

The low bidder, Millenium Pools and Spas, LLC, has been found to be responsive and responsible.

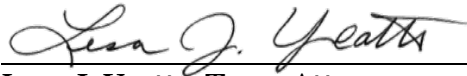

Resolution- to award IFB Contract #23-05 Swimming Pool Whitecoat.

The Herndon Community Center pool is in need of maintenance in the form of white coating. An Invitation for Bid process was used to solicit qualified vendors to apply the whitecoat to the pool. The Invitation for Bid was posted on May 30, 2023 on the eVA Commonwealth of Virginia procurement website and the Town of Herndon website to maximize competition. Three bids were received and opened on June 13, 2023 at a public bid opening:

The lowest bidder was determined to be responsive and responsible and funds to support the FY 2024 pool whitecoat are available through the town's American Rescue Plan Act funding.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council of the Town of Herndon, Virginia that:

1. The Town Council awards IFB Contract #23-05 to Millenium Pools and Spas, LLC in the amount of \$69,356; and
2. The Town Manager is authorized to sign the contract, and any other documents or actions to effectuate the award.

Description:

Sugarland Run (North) Stream Restoration is an identified project in the Town's Capital Improvement Program. This project will be designed to address the quality of the Town's stream banks and stream valley conditions. The project addresses a regional mandate by the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) to improve the condition of the Chesapeake Bay with reduction of the Total Maximum Daily Load (TDML) of nutrients.

The Town is part of the Fairfax County's Stormwater Service District and the Town entered into a Cooperative Agreement known as the "Cooperative Agreement Between the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors, the Town of Vienna, and Town of Herndon to Share Certain Stormwater Service District Fees and Responsibility for Related Services" to share funds and responsibilities to maintain, operate and improve stormwater systems to meet the Chesapeake Bay TMDL and other water quality goals. Under the Cooperative Agreement, Fairfax County ("the County") agrees to pay annually to the Town a percentage of Stormwater Service District Fees that are collected from the residents of the Town, "Paid Herndon Revenue." Additionally, the County agrees to support and fund special projects throughout the Stormwater Service District to assist the towns with implementing and paying for improvement projects that otherwise exceed the annual percentage fees received from the Stormwater Service District.

The Town is seeking to utilize a portion of these special project funds to design and implement the Sugarland Run (North) Stream Restoration Project, which will be located within the boundaries of the Town and will restore a portion of the body of water know as Sugarland Run North, from Elden Street south to the previously finished Sugarland Run (South) Stream Restoration project. Approximately 1,200 linear feet of stream channel and 1,150 linear feet of outfall channel will be repaired. The start of the project is approximately 1,200 linear feet North of the W & OD crossing.

Under the Cooperative Agreement, Stormwater Service District funds can be used for the project because the project meets the water quality objectives with respect to the Chesapeake Bay TMDL obligations. The project is estimated to cost Three million, nine hundred and sixteen thousand dollars (\$3,916,000) and is estimated to take approximately four years.

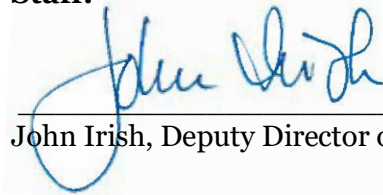
Fiscal Impact:

Pursuant to the proposed “Sugarland Run (North) Stream Restoration Funding Agreement” with Fairfax County, the Town will receive a County Contribution totaling Three million, nine hundred and sixteen thousand dollars (\$3,916,000) for the design and construction of the project. Starting in FY 2024, the Town will receive Seven hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$750,000) for project design. Upon completion of the design, the County will provide the Town Two million and sixteen thousand dollars (\$2,016,000) for the initial phase of construction. In the following fiscal year, the County will provide the Town with an additional One million one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$1,150,000) for the remaining contribution to complete construction of the project. The County’s Contribution for this project will not be charged against the annually accrued “Paid Herndon Revenues.” Any remaining design funds after completion of the design, may be utilized for the purpose of construction and will reduce the amount of construction funds needed during construction, pending the outcome of the final bid award amount including contingency funds.

Resolution- to approve a funding agreement between the Board of Supervisors of Fairfax County and the Town of Herndon to receive funds to design and implement the Sugarland Run (North) Stream Restoration Project.

The Town is part of the Fairfax County's Stormwater Service District and the County, Town, and the Town of Vienna have entered into a Cooperative Agreement ("Agreement") to share funds and responsibility to maintain, operate, and improve stormwater systems to meet the Chesapeake Bay Total Maximum Daily Load ("TMDL") and other water quality goals.

Under the Agreement, the County annually pays the Town a percentage of the Stormwater Service District Fees that are collected from residents of the Town; and the County also supports and funds qualifying special projects.

The County has agreed to pay the Town special project funds totaling Three million, nine hundred and sixteen thousand dollars (\$3,916,000) for the design and construction of the Sugarland Run (North) Stream Restoration Project that meets the water quality objectives with respect to the Chesapeake Bay TMDL obligations.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council for the Town of Herndon, Virginia that:

1. The Town Council approves the funding agreement between the Board of Supervisors of Fairfax County and the Town of Herndon to receive funds totaling Three million, nine hundred and sixteen thousand dollars (\$3,916,000) to design and implement the Sugarland Run (North) Stream Restoration Project.
2. The Mayor of the Town of Herndon, Virginia is authorized to sign and deliver this funding agreement on such form approved by the Town Attorney and any other instrument necessary to evidence or effectuate this agreement.

SUGARLAND RUN (NORTH)
STREAM RESTORATION FUNDING AGREEMENT

This Agreement (“Agreement”) made and entered into this _____ day of _____, 2023, by and between the **BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF FAIRFAX COUNTY, VIRGINIA** (the "County"), a body politic, and the **TOWN OF HERNDON** (the “Town”) (collectively, the “Parties”).

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Town has requested funds to design and implement the Sugarland Run (North) Stream Restoration Project (the “Project”), which will be located within the boundaries of the Town and will restore a portion of the body of water known as Sugarland Run North and

WHEREAS, the location of the Project is located between Longitude 77.3693°W and Latitude 38.9621°N and 77.3711°W and 38.96668°N and more specifically shown on the Fairfax County Real Property Identification Map as Tax Map No. 17-1((6)) parcel J4; and

WHEREAS, the Project is within the Chesapeake Bay, Potomac River, and Sugarland Run watersheds;

WHEREAS, the Town is part of the County’s Stormwater Service District and the County, Town, and the Town of Vienna have entered into an agreement known as the “Cooperative Agreement Between the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors, the Town of Vienna, and Town of Herndon to Share Certain Stormwater Service District Fees and Responsibility for Related Projects” (the “Cooperative Agreement”) to share funds and responsibility to maintain, operate, and improve stormwater systems to meet the Chesapeake Bay Total Maximum Daily Load (“TMDL”) and other water quality goals.

WHEREAS, under the Cooperative Agreement, annually, the County pays the Town a percentage of the Stormwater Service District Fees that are collected from residents of the Town (the “Paid Herndon Revenues”); and

WHEREAS, the Town and County agree that under the Cooperative Agreement, Stormwater Service District funds can be used for the Project because the Project meets

the water quality objectives of each locality and their respective Chesapeake Bay TMDL obligations; and

WHEREAS, the Project is estimated to cost three million nine hundred and sixteen thousand dollars (\$3,916,000) (the “Total Project Cost”); and

WHEREAS, that County intends to fund the design and construction of the Project from the Stormwater Budget; and

WHEREAS, the Town intends to dedicate Town staff expertise and time for the purpose of supporting, developing, and implementing the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals, which are incorporated herein as if restated as binding provisions of this agreement, the mutual promises contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of all of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto further agree as follows:

1. Upon execution of this Agreement, the County will grant to the Town funds in the amount of seven hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$750,000) (the “Design Funds”) in Fiscal Year 2024 for the design of the Project, to be paid with monies from the County’s Stream and Water Quality Improvement Project (fund I/O 2G25-029-001) of the Stormwater Budget (fund 400-C40100, Stormwater Services).

2. Upon completion of the design of the Project, the County will grant to the Town an additional two million and sixteen thousand dollars (\$2,016,000) in a subsequent fiscal year (Construction Year 1) for the construction of the Project, as designed, except that if those funds are unavailable in the Stormwater Budget at the time of completion, they will be paid at such time as they become available.

3. The County will grant the Town one million one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$1,150,000) in a subsequent fiscal year to Construction Year 1 (Construction Year 2) to complete construction of the Project. The Design Funds plus the construction funds issued to the Town during Construction Years 1 and 2 are hereinafter referred to as the “County Contribution”.

4. Completion of the design of the Project occurs when the Town informs the County that all construction documents are complete and all permits for the construction have been obtained. Any remaining design funds may be utilized for the purpose of

construction and will reduce the amount of construction funds that are identified to be granted in paragraphs 2 and 3.

5. The County Contribution will not be charged against the PAID HERNDON REVENUES as set forth in the Cooperative Agreement, but rather, are a separate grant to the Town from the County.

6. The Town will dedicate Town staff expertise and time for the purpose of supporting, developing, and implementing the Project.

7. The County Contribution must be used and expended solely for the purpose of designing and constructing the Project and not for the cost of any feasibility study or acquisition of any lands or easements necessary for the completion of the Project.

8. The Town will acquire, at its sole expense, any and all land or easements, or other interests in real property, if any, that are necessary to complete the Project.

9. The Town, at its sole expense, will administer the design and construction contracts, obtain approval of all plans, and obtain all permits necessary for the completion of the Project.

10. The Town will notify the County if the Town, at any time, modifies the scope of the Project, which is generally described herein above. If the scope of the Project's design, in the sole judgment of the County, significantly deviates from the design scope described in the Plan, the Town must, within 30 days after notification by the County of such deviation, reimburse to the County the amount of the Total Contribution.

11. The Town will provide the County with a copy of the final site plan for the Project.

12. The Town must retain all invoices and all records of payments for any and all services rendered for the design, construction, and any related expenses for completion of the Project, and copies of any such invoices and records of payments must be provided to the County upon request within three business days after such a request.

13. If at any time the Town abandons or otherwise ceases the Project for any reason, the Town must immediately return any amount of the County Contribution not expended in accordance with this agreement and all invoices and records of payments.

“Abandon,” as used herein, includes, but is not limited to, the failure to initiate or the termination of the design or construction before the Project’s completion.

14. If the Town is awarded federal-issued or state-issued grant funds for the Project, the Town will remit to the County an amount equal to the value of such grant.

15. The County, in its sole discretion, may agree to pay cost overruns that exceed the Total Project Cost, including construction costs that exceed the current estimate, change orders and/or related costs that arise during construction of the Project, but only to the extent that funds are available in the County’s Stream and Water Quality Improvement Project (fund I/O 2G25-029-001) of the Stormwater Budget (fund 400-C40100, Stormwater Services) and are not more than 10% of the estimated Project Cost.

16. The Town must complete the Project not later than four years after this agreement is executed.

17. The Project is subject to the Cooperative Agreement, and, as such, the total pollutant load reduction credits for the Project will be apportioned among the parties as established pursuant to the terms of the that agreement or any amendments or attachments thereto.

18. This agreement can only be modified in writing and signed by both parties.

Description:

Provided to you is a proposed Third Sublicense Extension between the Town and NextStop for space at 750 Center Street and a draft approving Resolution for consideration.

NextStop currently is sublicensee to 2,790 sq. ft. of space in the building licensed to the Town by Comstock and is used for storage, construction, or dismantling of theater props, sets, and other supplies consistent with a theatrical company.

Their current sublicense expired on June 30, 2023, the extension allows for the sublicense to continue on a month-to-month basis until June 30, 2024 and can be cancelled with 30 days' notice.

The rent for this space is currently \$1.00 per term, consistent with similar leases on Town property and is proposed to remain the same.

Fiscal Impact:

Based on recent comparable rental spaces in the Downtown, Economic Development staff estimates market rent for this space to currently be \$22 per square foot.

Staff Recommendation:

The Mayor and Town Council approve the Resolution as proposed.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council for the Town of Herndon, Virginia that:

1. The Town Council approves a Third Extension of Sublicense dated June 13, 2023 between the Town of Herndon ("Town") and The Elden Street Players d/b/a NextStop Theatre Company ("Sublicensee").
2. This instrument extends the expiration date of the original Sublicense Agreement dated December 28, 2020, as extended by the Extension of Sublicense dated December 27, 2021, and as extended by the Second Extension of Sublicense dated June 14, 2022, for a period of 1 year, to June 30, 2024, for the use of property licensed to the Town at 750 Center Street.
3. In all other respects the original sublicense remains in effect.
4. The Mayor is authorized to sign and deliver this Third Extension of Sublicense and any other instrument necessary to evidence or support the Extension.

Third Extension of Sublicense

This Third Extension of Sublicense dated June 13, 2023, hereby extends the June 30, 2023 termination date of the existing Sublicense between the Town of Herndon, a Virginia municipal corporation (Town) and The Elden Street Players d/b/a NextStop Theatre Company (Sublicensee), dated December 28, 2020, as extended by the Extension of Sublicense dated December 27, 2021, and as extended by the Second Extension of Sublicense dated June 14, 2022 for approximately 2,790 square feet of space located at 750 Center Street (the Sublicense) for a period of 1 year (the Extension).

THEREFORE, for the consideration stated in the Sublicense and herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. The Sublicense is incorporated by reference.
2. The Sublicense shall terminate on **June 30, 2024**.

Summary:

The Revenue Sharing Program for fiscal years (FY) 2027 and 2028 is administered by the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) to provide additional funding to construct, improve, or maintain the roadway systems. A fifty percent (50%) Local Match is required under VDOT's Revenue Sharing program.

On June 29, 2023, town staff submitted to VDOT a Revenue Sharing pre-application to determine eligibility for the 'East Elden Street Widening and Improvements (UPC 50100)' project to address a funding need for this capital improvement project. Town staff desires to continue processing this year's Revenue Sharing application of up to \$10,000,000 of which fifty percent (50%), or \$5,000,000, is to serve as the town's local match to be directed to the project.

The purpose of VDOT's Revenue Sharing Program is to provide additional funding for use by localities to construct, reconstruct, improve, or maintain their roadway systems. The Revenue Sharing Program also provides funding for immediately needed improvements or to supplement funds for existing projects.

Revenue Sharing Program funds are generally expected to be in active development, leading to their completion within the near term. Projects receiving funds from the program should have construction initiated within two fiscal years subsequent to allocation, or the funds may be in jeopardy for reallocation to other projects.

A successful application of Revenue Sharing funding to the 'East Elden Street Widening and Improvements (UPC 50100)' project will enable this capital improvement project to move forward to construction in year 2027.

Background:

The scope for this VDOT-administered project is to provide congestion relief by widening East Elden Street to six lanes with a raised median between Fairfax County Parkway and Herndon

Parkway, continuing as a four-lane section with a raised median and dedicated turning lanes between Herndon Parkway and Van Buren Street, transitioning to a two-lane section with a left-turn lane when reaching Monroe Street. The project also includes bridge upgrade/flood mitigation measures, improved traffic signalization, bus transit enhancements, as well as ADA pedestrian sidewalks, bike lanes, and cycle tracks on both sides of the roadway with connectivity to three regional trails and the Herndon Metrorail Station.

Fiscal Impact:

Jurisdictions must commit a minimum of fifty percent (50%) in local matching funds within the two fiscal years subsequent to the Revenue Sharing allocation. The town's fifty percent (50%) Local Match would be comprised of town general funds, town bond funds, and/or Northern Virginia Transportation Authority (NVTA) Local Revenue of up to \$5,000,000 (i.e. \$2,500,000 for FY 2027 and \$2,500,000 for FY 2028). If awarded, the town's application would be for two fiscal years (FY 2027 and FY 2028), with funding available July 1, 2026 and July 1, 2027, respectively.

If the town is successful in obtaining these VDOT Revenue Sharing funds, then the funds will cover half of the current shortfall and thus reduce the amount of funding for which the town would otherwise be responsible.

Town Council Alternatives:

The following alternatives are available to the Town Council:

1. Approve the resolution endorsing the grant application for funding under the VDOT FY 2027 and FY 2028 Revenue Sharing program.
2. Deny endorsement and approval of the resolution.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Mayor and Town Council adopt the attached resolution endorsing the request for funding through the VDOT FY 2027 and FY 2028 Revenue Sharing program for the VDOT administered 'East Elden Street Widening and Improvements' project.

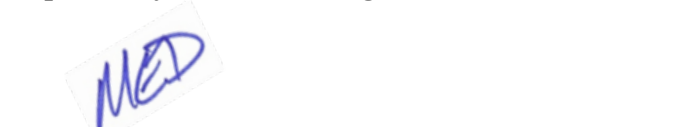

Summary:

The Revenue Sharing Program for fiscal years (FY) 2027 and 2028 is administered by the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) to provide additional funding to construct, improve, or maintain the roadway systems. A fifty percent (50%) Local Match is required under VDOT's Revenue Sharing program.

On June 29, 2023, town staff submitted to VDOT a Revenue Sharing pre-application to determine eligibility for the 'Herndon Parkway at Sunset Park Drive Intersection Improvements' project to address a funding need for this capital improvement project. Town staff desires to continue processing this year's Revenue Sharing application of up to \$4,000,000 of which fifty percent (50%), or \$ 2,000,000, is to serve as the town's local match to be directed to the project.

The purpose of VDOT's Revenue Sharing Program is to provide additional funding for use by localities to construct, reconstruct, improve, or maintain their roadway systems. Revenue Sharing Program funds are generally expected to be in active development, leading to their completion within the near term. Projects receiving funds from the program should have construction initiated within two fiscal years subsequent to allocation, or the funds may be in jeopardy for reallocation to other projects. A successful application of Revenue Sharing funding to the 'Herndon Parkway at Sunset Park Drive Intersection Improvements' project will enable this capital improvement project to move forward to construction in year 2027.

Background:

The project scope is to provide for a reconfigured and realigned intersection to include 5' ADA sidewalk/curb cuts, crosswalks, and street lighting. Herndon Parkway will include a raised median with pedestrian refuge islands and dedicated turning lanes. The project also includes

extending, along the south side of Herndon Parkway, the sidewalk and cycle track improvements from the adjoining Widen East Spring Street project, of which the construction is now underway.

Fiscal Impact:

Jurisdictions must commit a minimum of fifty percent (50%) in local matching funds within the two fiscal years subsequent to the Revenue Sharing allocation. The town's fifty percent (50%) Local Match would be comprised of town general funds, town bond funds, and/or Northern Virginia Transportation Authority (NVTA) Local Revenue of up to \$2,000,000 (i.e. \$1,000,000 for FY 2027 and \$1,000,000 for FY 2028). If awarded, the town's application would be for two fiscal years (FY 2027 and FY 2028), with funding available July 1, 2026 and July 1, 2027, respectively.

If the town is successful in obtaining these VDOT Revenue Sharing funds, then the funds will cover half of the current shortfall and thus reduce the amount of funding for which the town would otherwise be responsible.

1. Approve the resolution endorsing the grant application for funding under the VDOT FY 2027 and FY 2028 Revenue Sharing program.
2. Deny endorsement and approval of the resolution.
